1. Animal Welfare & Control Review The Panel met with the Chief States Veterinary Officer (the 'CSV') as part of its ongoing Animal Welfare & Control Review and the forthcoming debate on the principles of the <i>Draft Animal Welfare (Jersey) Law 202-</i>, scheduled for 20th January 2026. The CSV explained that the <i>Animal Welfare (Jersey) Law 2004</i> was based on outdated UK legislation dating back to 1911 and is no longer fit for purpose. Although it reflected standards at the time of enactment, changes in animal behaviour research, breeding practices, and broader welfare expectations had rendered parts of the 2004 law obsolete. She confirmed that while the review of the legislation began several years ago, a full redraft was not completed until now due to competing priorities, including work related to Brexit. It was also explained that updating the legislation at this time would strengthen Jersey's position in the upcoming Brexit "reset" negotiations. The CSV identified key enforcement challenges under the existing law, including limited powers of entry and seizure. This restricted the ability to intervene proactively, particularly where concerns existed but visible suffering had not yet occurred. Livestock premises were inspected routinely, whereas response to companion animal issues was generally complaint-driven. The CSV highlighted that stronger preventive powers in the new law would enable earlier intervention. In 2025, the States' Veterinary Office received 103 welfare complaints, primarily concerning dogs and horses. While complaints often related to companion animals, the majority of the day-to-day work of States Vet Officers involved livestock. The CSV described challenges in distinguishing between welfare complaints and general nuisance issues, particularly in urban areas such as St Helier. The States Veterinary Office regularly liaised with Environmental Health officers in such cases. The Panel queried whether the current Law reflected modern welfare standards. The CSV noted that while good practice occurred in some areas, clearer legal provisions were needed to shift the focus toward prevention. Existing offences often required evidence of actual suffering before action could be taken.	

The CSV also explained that under the new legislative model, ministerial orders would allow for more detailed and flexible provisions, including licensing schemes. While licensing powers existed under the 2004 Law, they were too rigid and not easily adaptable. Under the new framework, licensing provisions would be more targeted and detailed in their ability to set out specific conditions for different licensing requirements.

The CSV acknowledged that meaningful consultation was essential and committed to engaging with relevant stakeholders where orders may have had material impact. While some engagement had already taken place, further outreach remained possible.

The CSV noted that animal welfare law in the UK and EU was always evolving, particularly around sentience and species-specific needs. The new legislation aimed to better align Jersey with these developments and provide the flexibility needed to respond to emerging science and societal expectations.

The Panel thanked the Chief States Vet for her time and insight.
