Proposed use of former Jersey Gas site: request for reconsideration P.45/2025

THE STATES commenced consideration of a proposition of the Connétable of St. Helier entitled ‘Proposed use of former Jersey Gas site: request for reconsideration’ (P.45/2025) and rejected the proposition to request the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning to reconsider the proposal to build a new primary school on the site immediately adjacent to the Millennium Town Park, formerly occupied by Jersey Gas (‘the site’) and, following consultation with the Council of Ministers, to present a report to the States Assembly by the end of 2025 providing–

- (a) an assessment of the need for a new town primary school in the light of demographic changes, including the capacity of the existing primary school estate to meet demand for new school places, and any alternative approaches to meeting this demand;
- (b) data as to the number of households located within 400 metres of the site, and estimates of the numbers of potential users by age group of an expanded Millennium Town Park, including those living outside this radius, visitors, shoppers and office workers;
- (c) an analysis of the health and other benefits provided to the whole community by the Millennium Town Park, especially the ageing population, and an assessment of the likely impact of doubling its size, compared to the current proposals to develop new ‘pocket parks’ on sites such as those presently occupied by Springfield School and Le Bas Centre;
- (d) an assessment of the expected traffic impacts on the St. Helier road network of a new primary school constructed on the site, including air quality levels in surrounding streets, and an assessment of the role ‘active travel’ could play in mitigating them; and
- (e) up to date financial projections on the cost of building and maintaining the proposed new primary school, compared with the costs of meeting the demand for new primary school places by alternative means.
