STATES OF JERSEY LAW 2005: DELEGATION OF FUNCTIONS – MINISTER FOR EDUCATION AND LIFELONG LEARNING – APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT MINISTERS

REPORT

On 1st July 2026, the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning made a Ministerial Decision delegating certain of her functions under Articles 28, 30 and 30A of the [States of Jersey Law 2005](#) (see Decision reference MD-ELL-2026-566, available at www.gov.je).

The terms of the delegations, and the legislation under which those delegations were made, were recorded in a Report attached to the Ministerial Decision, as shown below –

Delegate:	Senator Serena Kersten
Functions delegated:	The Assistant Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning will have delegated responsibility for the physical education curriculum
Scope of delegation:	Full delegation in respect of the above area. This includes the authority to sign ministerial decisions in respect of this area and in respect of any provisions included in any relevant legislation. In the event that the Minister and Deputy Lucy Stephenson are both unavailable or out of the Island, the Minister also delegated all powers and functions conferred upon or vested in the Minister, including the power to make an enactment, and all other areas where the Minister would otherwise have to act and be advised.

Delegate:	Deputy Lucy Stephenson of St. Mary, St. Ouen and St. Peter
Functions delegated:	Assistant Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning
Scope of delegation:	In the event that the Minister is unavailable or out of the Island, the Minister also delegated all powers and functions conferred upon or vested in the Minister, including the power to make an enactment, and all other areas where the Minister would otherwise have to act and be advised.

Delegate:	Senator Sir Mark Boleat
Functions delegated:	Assistant Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning
