Constituency Statistics Report 2026

Introduction

This report brings together key statistics about the constituency of St Helier North to help inform and support constituents ahead of the June 2026 elections in Jersey. By presenting clear, accessible data on the makeup of our community, the report aims to provide a useful snapshot of local demographics, social characteristics and housing trends relevant to voters, candidates and anyone with an interest in the constituency.

The information in this report has been sourced from Statistics Jersey, drawing primarily on the most recent [Jersey Census in 2021](#) and the [Jersey Opinions and Lifestyle Survey 2025](#). These statistics offer the most reliable and comprehensive picture of life within St Helier North and cover areas such as population, age structure, employment, household composition and other key indicators that help illustrate the character of our constituency.

Key Figures

Population

The total population of St Helier North was **12,140**, the third highest of all constituencies.

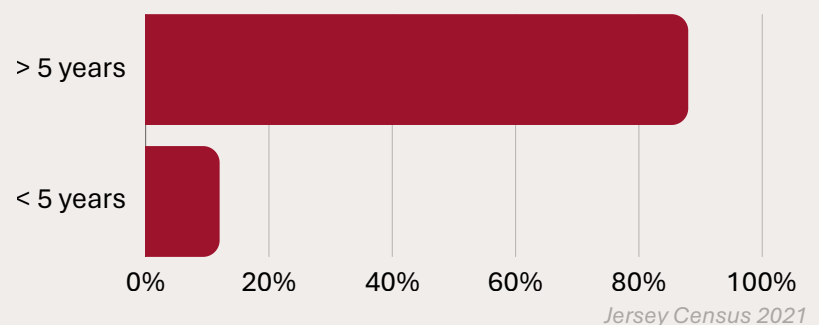

Length of residence in Jersey

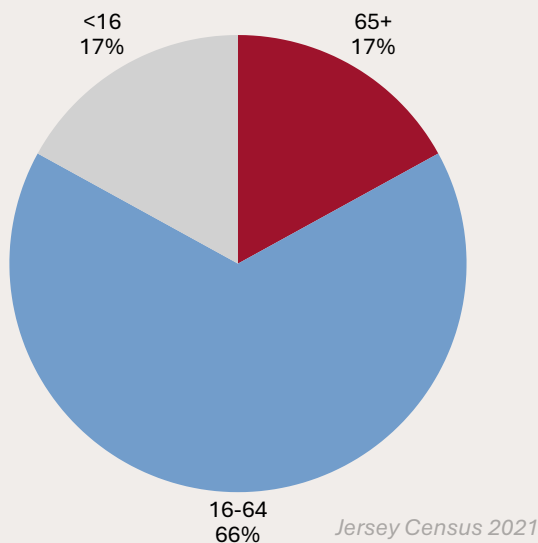
Approximately **1 in 8** (12%) of St Helier North residents had lived in Jersey for fewer than 5 years and 88% for more than 5 years.



Key Figures

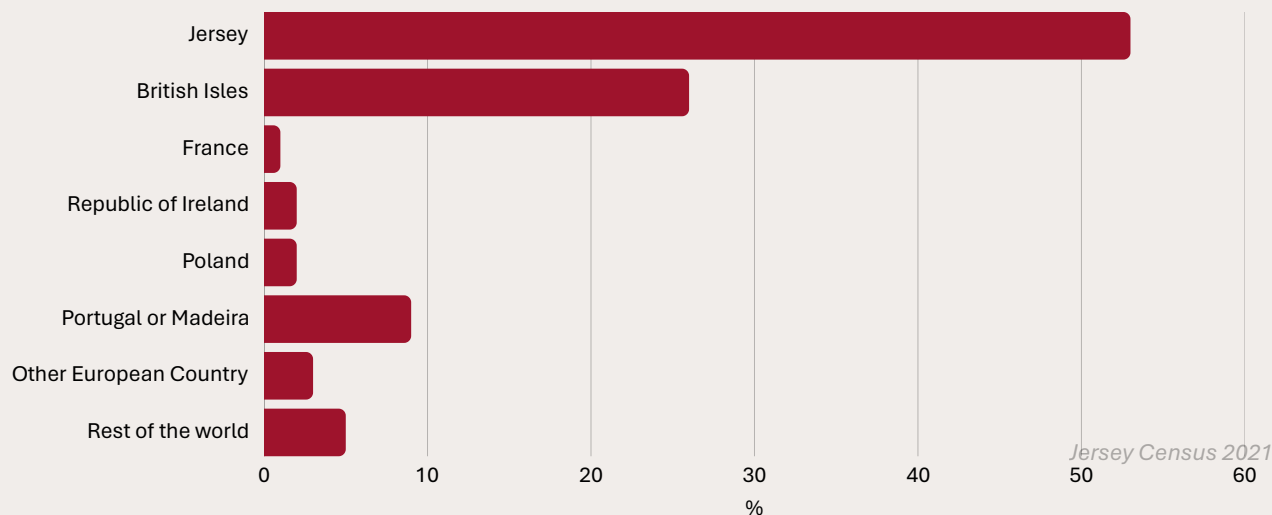
Young, working-age and elderly people

St Helier North sat around the middle of the range for the proportion of working-age residents at **66%**, compared with a high of 76% in St Helier Central and a low of 61% in St Brelade.



Place of birth and ethnicity

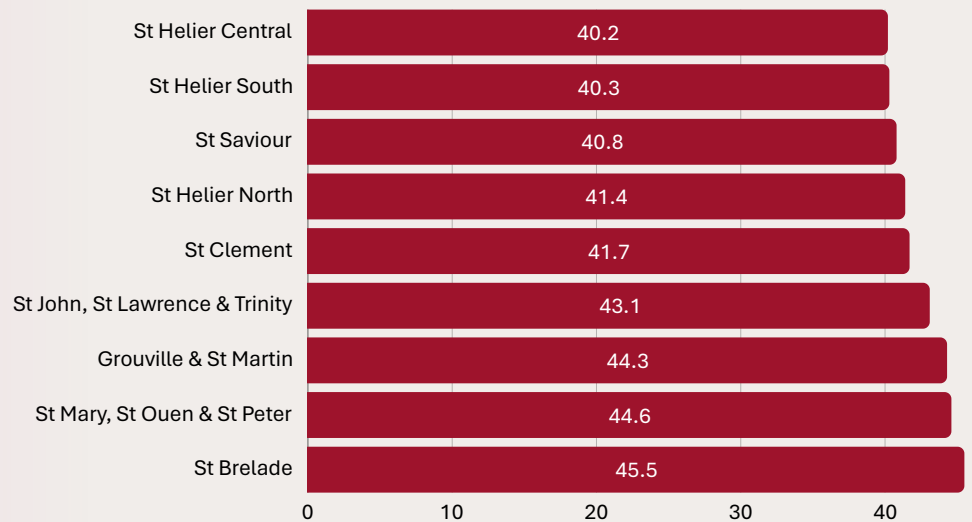
St Helier North had the joint third highest percentage (**9%**) of people born in Portugal or Madeira compared with other constituencies (St Helier Central had the highest with 18% while St Brelade and Grouville & St Martin had the joint lowest with 3%).

Average age

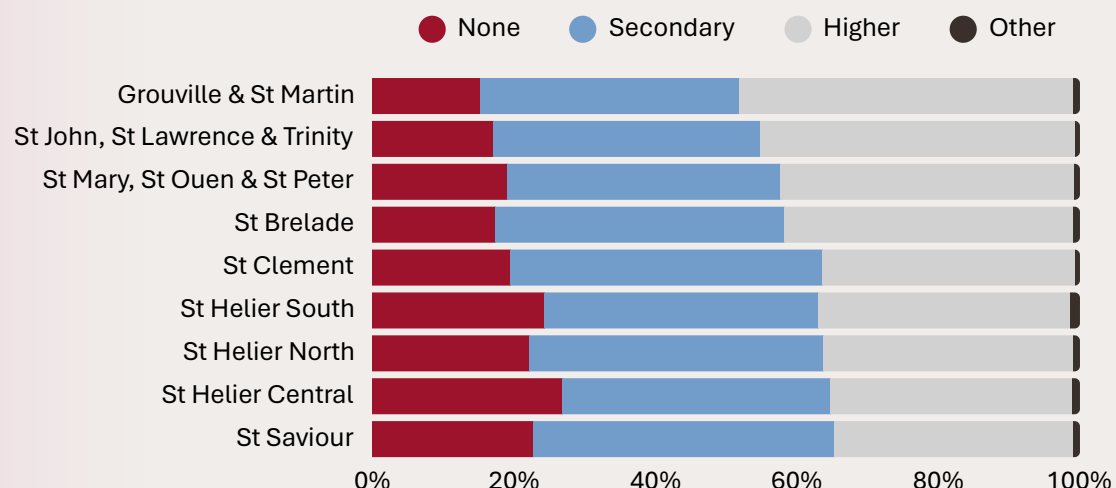
The mean age of St Helier North residents was fourth lowest of all constituencies at **41.4 years**.

Higher Education Attainment

Seventy-seven percent of St Helier North residents were educated to secondary or degree level (84% in Grouville & St Martin and 76% in St Saviour). **22%** of St Helier North residents had not received secondary or higher education.

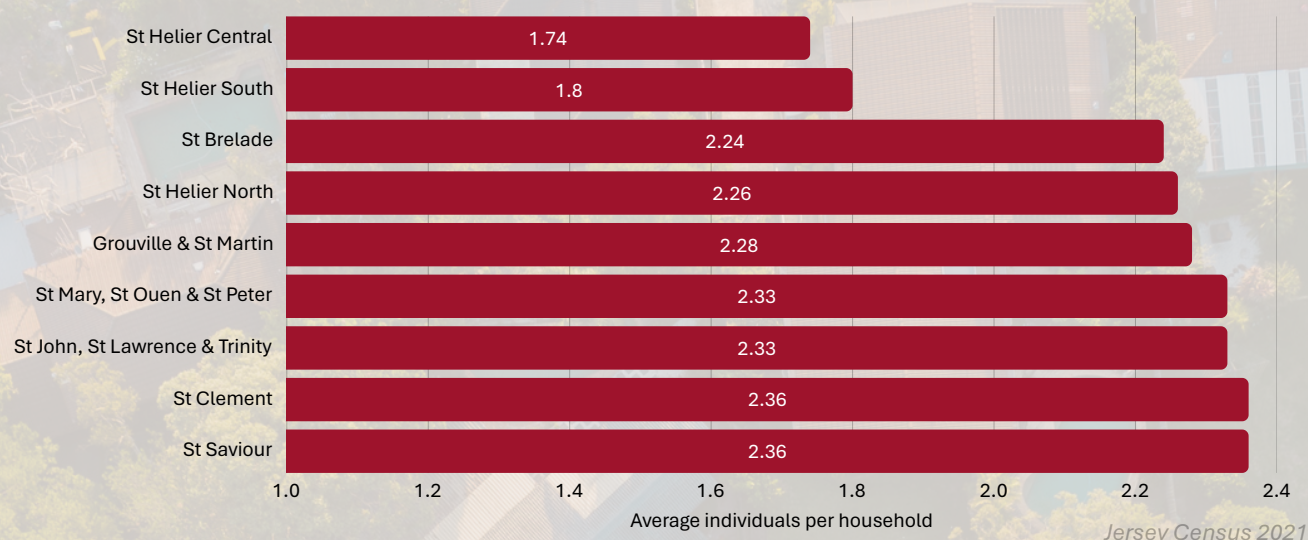

Housing & Households

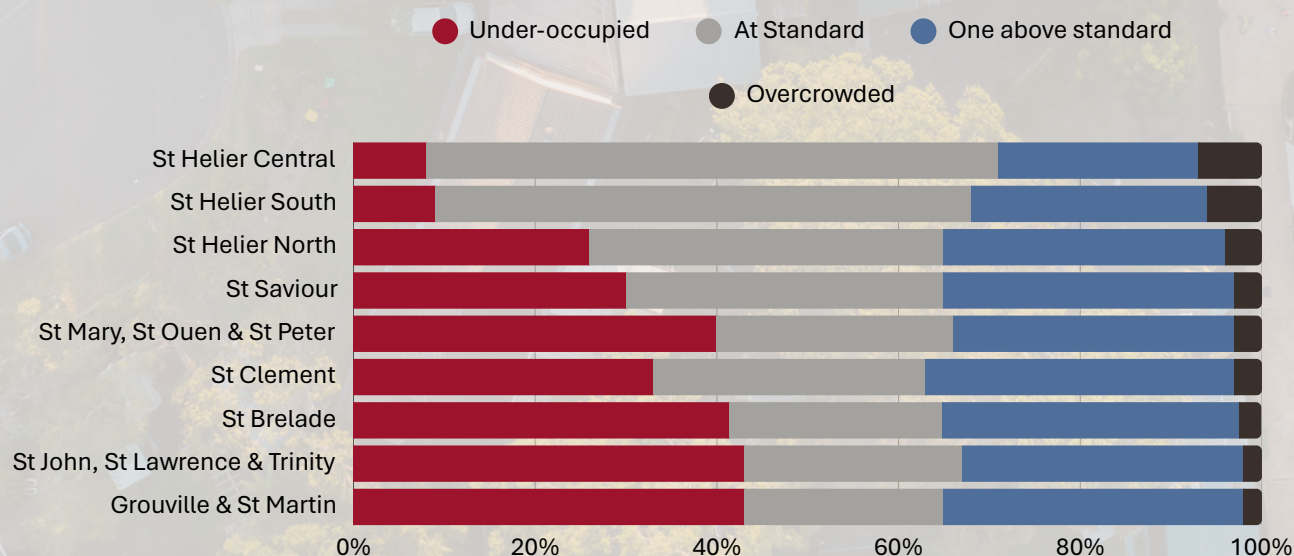
Size of households

St Helier North had the fourth lowest average household size of all constituencies. An average of **2.26** individuals resided per household here compared to 1.74 in St Helier Central.



Overcrowding

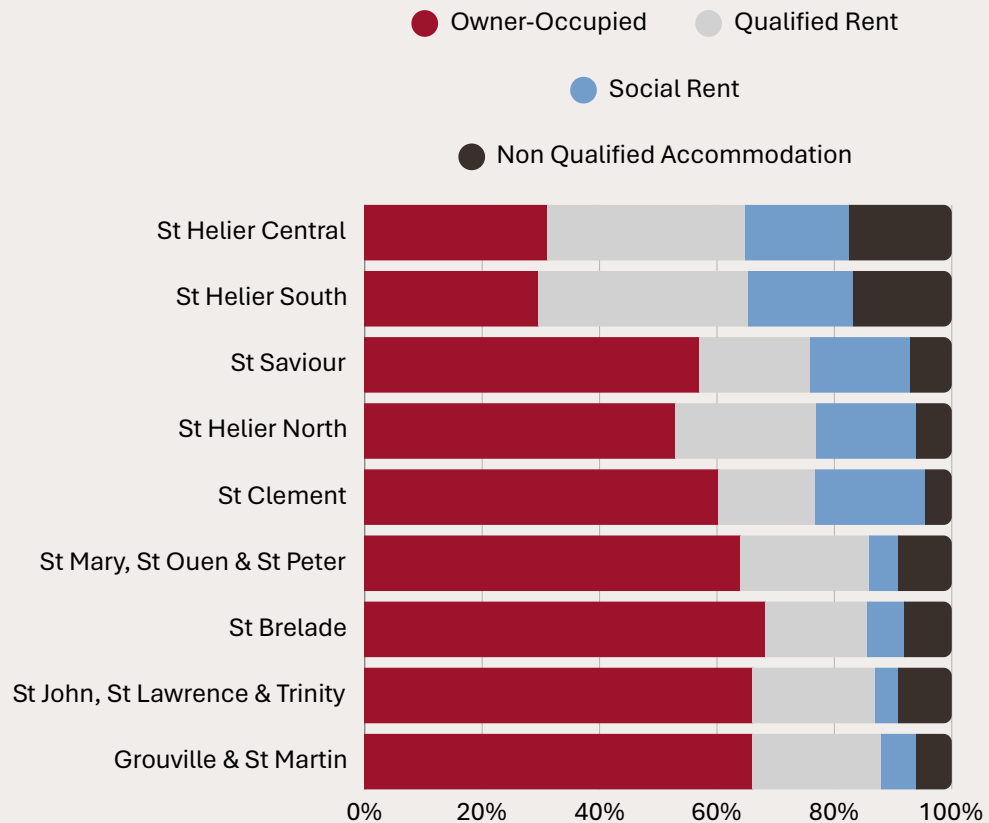
In St Helier North, **4%** of households were overcrowded and **26%** were under-occupied. This was notably higher than St Helier Central, where just 8% of households were under-occupied.



Housing & Households

Tenure

Approximately **1 in 2** (53%) households in St Helier North were owner-occupied. St Helier North had the third highest percentage of households in qualified rental properties at **24%**.

Cars per household

The average number of cars per household in St Helier North was **1.44**, which was the third lowest of all constituencies.

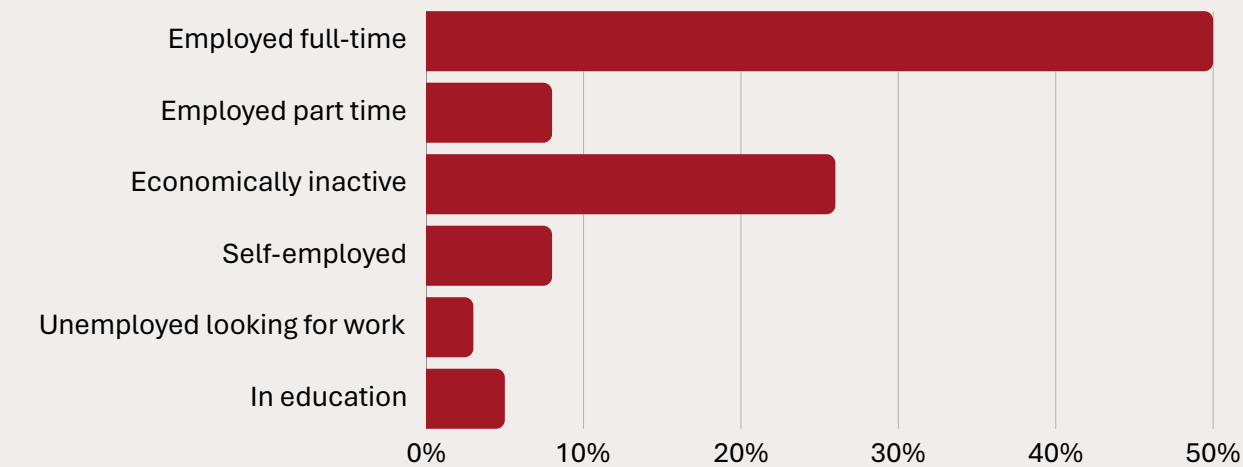


Cost of Living

Economic status

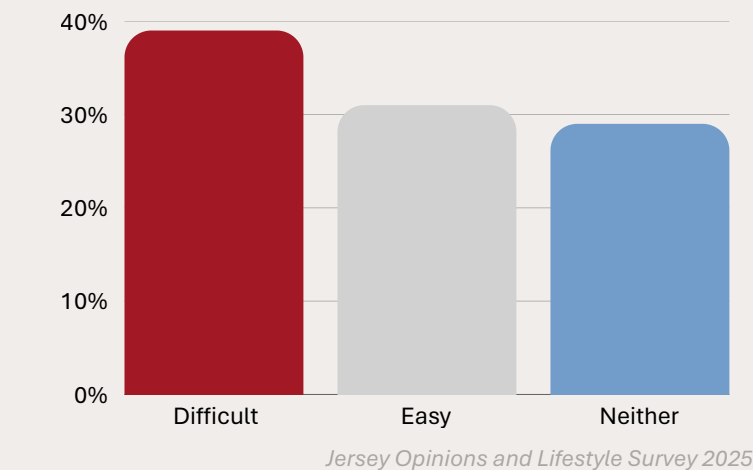
Fifty percent of St Helier North adults were in full-time employment (joint third highest of all constituencies). It also had the third lowest number of adults who were economically inactive (**26%**).

Coping financially

St Helier North had the second highest proportion (**39%**) of respondent households who found it difficult to cope financially. In comparison, St John, St Lawrence & Trinity had the lowest proportion, with 17% who reported finding it difficult to cope financially.

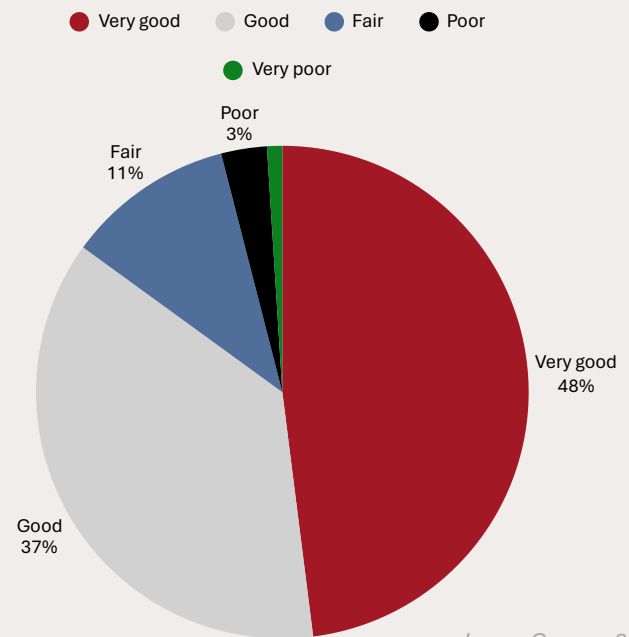




Health & Wellbeing

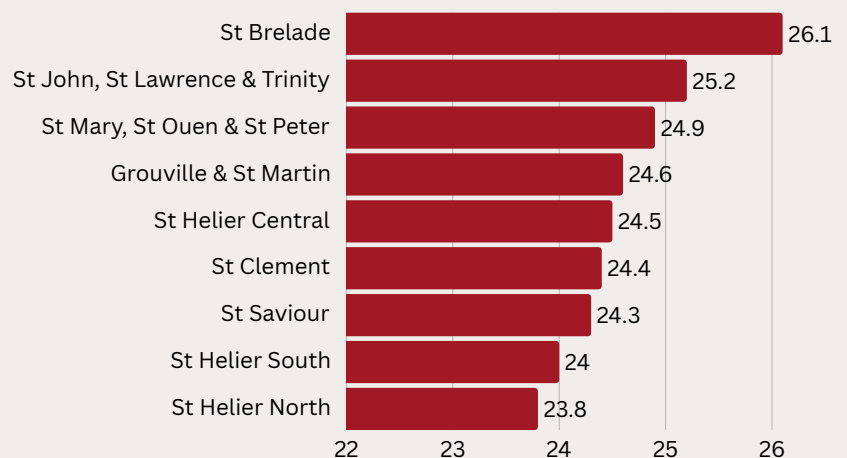
Physical and mental health

Approximately **1 in 2 (48%)** people in St Helier North reported being in very good health. This was compared with St John, St Lawrence & Trinity and Grouville & St Martin which had the highest proportion of people who reported being in very good health (54%).



Jersey Census 2021

Residents of St Helier North scored lowest for their overall mental wellbeing (including life satisfaction, happiness, anxiety and feeling worthwhile) with a mean score of **23.8**.

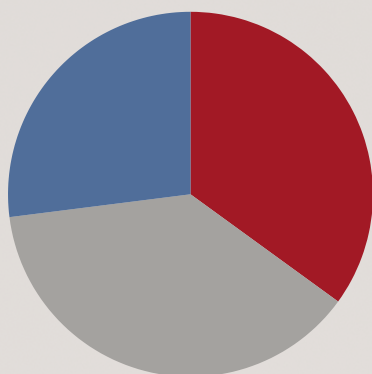

Civic Engagement

In 2022, **64%** of the St Helier North voting age population were registered to vote. However, the percentage of those who voted was just **36%**.

Voting intentions

St Helier North had the second lowest proportion (**35%**) of respondents who planned to vote in the June 2026 election. **38%** of people said they wouldn't vote, while **27%** were unsure.

Trust in Government

St Helier North reported the joint second highest mean trust score in Government at **6.0** (overall result range was 5.4:6.2) compared to St Saviour which had the lowest at 5.4.

Trust in Your Constituency

St Helier North had the joint lowest mean trust score in its constituency at **6.1**.
