Quarterly Hearing Follow-up

Following our Quarterly Hearing on 4th July 2025, the Panel has agreed to request the following information, which was discussed during the hearing:

- An update on Treasury's considerations for the provision of the additional amount of £1,7 million funding which would be needed to progress the Dewberry House capital project.
- The extent to which capital projects' underspends may be redirected and the process followed under such circumstances.
- A copy of the bulletin issued to industry regarding the Pillar-Two workstream.

The Panel also heard from the Comptroller of Revenue that presently Revenue Jersey do not make use of a self-assessment system for taxation. However, that Revenue Jersey would like to move toward a system of self-assessment. Therefore, the Panel requests further detail of any considerations and/or work underway for progressing this workstream and its intended timeframe.

The Panel would appreciate to receive the above detail by no later than Monday 14th July 2025. Please note that it is the Panel's intention to publish the response it receives on the States Assembly website.
