**Follow-up - Quarterly Public Hearing: the Draft Road Traffic Law (Drug Driving)
(Jersey) Amendment Regulations 202-**

Dear Minister,

Thank you for your attendance at our Quarterly Public Hearing on 5th March 2026. Following that hearing, the Panel would be grateful to receive all available evidence relating to the consultations undertaken with private medical prescribers in respect of the Draft Road Traffic Law (Drug Driving) (Jersey) Amendment Regulations 202-.

In particular, we would appreciate receiving:

- A full list of all medical prescribers consulted,
- Any written or recorded advice provided,
- A detailed summary of the advice received from each prescriber, including any concerns raised or recommendations made;
- All evidence, studies, assessments or expert advice used to establish the link between a 5 µg/L THC limit and impairment, including any material that informed the conclusion that patients taking medicinal cannabis as prescribed would not exceed this threshold; and
- Any additional documentation that demonstrates how the input from these prescribers informed the proposed Regulations.

If any of the above information is sensitive or confidential, the Panel would be willing to receive it in confidence, either fully or in part, and will treat it accordingly. Please indicate clearly any material that you consider confidential so that it may be handled appropriately.

The Panel would be grateful to receive your written response within five working days of receipt of this letter. Please note that it is the Panel's intention to publish your response on the States Assembly website.
