Corporate Services Scrutiny Panel
Work Programme and Working Practices

The Corporate Services Scrutiny Panel ('the Panel') held its inaugural meeting on 21st July 2026. The Panel is comprised of myself as Chair, Deputy Lee Carpenter as Vice Chair and Deputies Chris Leck, Chris Rebindaine and Hilary Jeune. The Panel wishes you well in your new role and looks forward to working collaboratively, constructively and transparently with you, your Assistant Ministers and Department throughout this term.

Quarterly Hearings and Work Practices

The Panel understands that Officers have been liaising regarding dates for the Quarterly Hearings for 2026 and would be grateful if confirmation could be provided that the proposed dates for forthcoming hearings are acceptable. Subject to your availability, the Panel proposes that hearings be scheduled for Monday 14 September 09:15am-11:15am (Quarter Three), Monday 26 October 09:30am-11:30am and/or Monday 09 November 09:30am-11:30am (Quarter Four /Budget Review). The Panel proposes that both the October and November dates be held in the interim to accommodate its anticipated review of the Proposed Budget 2027- 30.

When discussing arrangements for its hearings the Panel noted the importance of maintaining discussions between Ministers and the Panel whenever possible. The Panel, therefore, requests that by default only Ministers attend public hearings seated at the table, in the main. While Officers are welcome to attend hearings in a supporting capacity, the Panel asks that attendance of Officers at the table be limited and only when invited to do so.

Work Programme

To inform the Panel's immediate work programme, the Panel requests the following information:

1. Details of your Ministerial priorities and legislative programme and the timeline for receiving these.
2. An outline of the process and progress to date for developing the Proposed Budget 2027-30, including the anticipated timeline for its lodging and debate.

The Panel has agreed some initial briefings and has requested that Officers liaise to make the necessary arrangements for the following briefings:

1. An introductory meeting with the Treasurer of the States of Jersey;
2. An update on procurement processes, immediate actions and any review thereof; and
3. An update on OECD Pillar 2 and Multinational Corporate Income Tax workstream.

The Panel would appreciate to receive a formal written response and the requested information by 31st July 2026. Please be aware that it is the Panel's intention to publish the response it receives on the States Assembly website. However, should any of the information provided be confidential, please can you inform the Panel accordingly.
